DISTRICT CONVENTION: 21–23 OCTOBER 2022 – LAKES ENTRANCE

As clubs are aware the 201V3 District Convention at Lakes Entrance will commence on 21 October to 23 October 2022. In order to meet the timeframes for having District projects, constitutional notice of motions and nominations etc. considered at the Convention, Clubs need to comply as follows:

- 1. Proposed District Projects must be submitted to the Cabinet Secretary at least 90 days prior to Convention, that is no later than 23 July 2022.
- 2. Nominations for District Governor, 1st Vice District Governor and 2nd Vice District Governor and, all constitutional notices of motions, must be submitted to the Cabinet Secretary at least 60 days prior to Convention, that is no later than 22 August 2022.
- 3. Representative nominations for VLF and Licola Board submitted to the Cabinet Secretary at least 30 days prior to Convention, that is no later than 21 September 2022.
- 4. Nominations for the position of International Director at least 30 days prior to the Convention, that is no later than 21 September 2022.

EAST GIPPSLAND TIMBERLAND MILLING

The East Gippsland Timber Milling Project assisted by Pat Grosse has made good progress in putting together a draft Strategic Plan 2022 – 2031. This document provides the project with a guide for our operations over the next nine years taking into account the dreams and hopes of the current committee.

Some Background and Context of The Milling Project

The East Gippsland Timber Milling Project was established as a joint project of Mitchell River Rotary Club and Bruthen Lions Club in February 2021 with the purpose of supporting the recovery of the East Gippsland farming community following the 2019/2020 Black Summer fires. This is achieved through the repurposing of burnt and fallen trees to rebuild farms from Sarsfield to Mallacoota.



The idea evolved from the devastating events of the fires as a community-led initiative to assist with bushfire clean up. East Gippsland is a high-risk area with three significant fires in the area since 2014, culminating in the Black Summer fires of 2019/2020. The Project provides a unique service to farming communities.

The current business model involves two portable Lucas mills that are each operated by a contractor and assistant, both of whom were previously unemployed and have been trained to operate as a business as well as the machinery. Initial funding has been sourced from government grants, securing funding for the interim.

The service is free to farmers whose properties were impacted by the Black Summer Fires of 2019/20, with considerable economic and social/mental health benefits. Our aim is to become sustainable and embedded in the community, able to respond to inevitable future disasters including floods and storms.

Our Purpose

To provide free milling operations to fallen timber on farms and land where it has been impacted by a natural disaster such as the 2020 fire event in East Gippsland. Timber cut to be used primarily for use in rebuilding of lost fences, yarding and shedding.

This will be organised by the Ecycle group and involves placing special containers in local locations for the public to deposit used household batteries. Clubs then collect and these will be collected from central locations in each of the zones.

JUNIOR PUBLIC SPEAKING

Good evening Lions,

There are only 13 Clubs participating this year in the Junior Public Speaking program, with only two Zones having more than one Club participating. The participating Clubs are listed below:

Zone 1 and 2: Lakes Lioness Lions Club

Zone 3: Briagolong and District

Zone 4: Heyfield

Zone 5: Moe

Zone 6: Willow Grove, Trafalgar, Warragul, and Drouin

Zone 8: Inverloch and District

Zone 10: Dromana, and Red Hill and District

Zone 11: Koo Wee Rup and District

Zone 12: Pakenham

Because there are a small number of Clubs participating in JPS, and most Zones have only one participating Club, we will do as we did last year, and have the winners at Club level competitions go straight through to the 201V3 District Semi-Finals. These semifinal competitions will be held in the eastern and western halves of the District after the end of school holidays early in October. One semi-final, for Lakes Lioness, Briagolong, Heyfield, Moe, Willow Grove, Trafalgar and Warragul is scheduled for 2pm on Sunday, 9th October at the Community Centre, Trafalgar. The other semi-final will be organised by Lion Ron Payne (thanks Ron) and will probably be held at Tooradin around the same date. This semi-final will be for Drouin, Pakenham, Inverloch, Koo Wee Rup and District, Dromana, and Red Hill and District. I will let you know the detail of date and venue once these have been confirmed.

The winners of each level at each semi-final, will compete in the District 201V3 Final competition to be conducted at the 201V3 District Convention at Lakes Entrance on Saturday, 22nd October. This will most likely be held in the morning, but I will confirm the time once the Convention program has been finalised.

There is approval in principle to the conduct of a "V Districts" final, to be held sometime probably in November. The detail of this is still the subject of inter-District discussions. Again, I will pass on any detail of this once it is known.


