

TWIN RIVERS LIONS CLUB

AN INNOVATIVE program is setting local children up for life, using the magic of picture books.

123Read2Me, the free children's book charity, partnered with the Twin Rivers Lions Club after the bushfires of 2019 to get kids reading again, and now Coles has come onboard to help. Thirteen Coles stores across Gippsland, Victoria will support the charity by accepting book donations in store since February.

"With the support from Coles, we will be able to expand our book donations and make it easier for the community to donate their children's books," 123Read2Me's Founder and Chief Visionary Melinda Shelley said.

"With the current cost-of-living pressures on families it is vital for every child to have access to quality books and to enjoy a story every day.

"Reading out loud for as little as ten minutes a day creates the brain pathways that make learning easier, and the best part is it is fun to do."

"Gippsland residents can drop off unwanted children's books suitable for babies through to teenagers to a donation bin located in Coles Supermarkets across the region to provide local kids the opportunity to fall in love with reading," Melinda said.

Coles combined with our network of local Lions Clubs, we can get more books into the hands of children right across Gippsland". Melinda explains that whilst the education department in Victoria acknowledges the work of 123Read2Me, there is no funding or support for what the charity does to redress the significant imbalance in literacy rates between advantaged and disadvantaged children.

Melinda Shelley and her charity are proudly part of the march to improve literacy at the grass roots level and are calling on Governments on all levels to lift their game and encourage Australian organisations to engage with 123Read2Me to improve literacy rates in Australia.

123Read2Me has already donated almost 700,000 books to children across Australia who don't have books at home.

Together with funds from 2022, we were able to raise \$71,110 to fund the sensory and interactive courtyard gardens in the Flinders Ward at Peninsula Health's Mornington Centre for dementia patients. LEONGATHA LIONS CLUB

In understanding the need to provide information to relatives, family search or historians, the Leongatha Cemetery Trust recognised the need for an information board at the cemetery which would be an all weather building and open to the public. So funding was sourced through a grant from the DHS and the Cemetery Trust own savings.

To complete the project, the Leongatha Lions then set about planning, assembling and erecting a rotunda to house an information board. The progress was not as smooth sailing when first planned as from start to finish the Covid pandemic and associated health directives curtailed a number of team meetings and planned working bees. Wearing masks and maintaining a physical distance was a project in itself for the Lions said Mike Touzel who was able to keep the work on track.

The project was completed in October last year and with the surrounding garden now planted, on Monday the 6th of March 2023 – the rotunda was officially handed over to the Leongatha Cemetery Trust Chair Ray Sullivan by the Leongatha Lions President David Thompson.
