PDG JOHN NANKERVIS 60 YEARS OF SERVICE

At the Dromana Lions Business Meeting on the 20th September 2023, Cabinet Secretary, Norma Barnard, presented PDG John Nankervis with his 60 Year Service Award on behalf of District 201V3 and the Lions Club of Dromana.

John joined Lions International on the 7th March 1963, being a Charter Member with the forming of the Lions Club of Moorabbin with which he served in most roles, including President, for some 14 years.

John took on the role of District Governor for the year from July 1975 until June 1976.



John was also very involved in the purchase and initial setting up of the Licola Village in the early years.

John also served at Sandringham and Mt Martha in various roles including President before transferring to Dromana on the 13 September 1993 where he served as President in 1995 and shortly after that became a Life Member.

John was awarded a Melvin Jones Award on the 5th September 1994.

At the age of 99 years, John has slowed down but still attends the occasional Business Meeting when able and likes to be involved with the Club when we run our Youth Projects and on special occasions.

PERSONAL LEADERSHIP DEVELOPMENT

Lions have an opportunity. That opportunity is to lead either as a member, or as a club leader. For example club sub-committees, major projects and working with other clubs.

As a Lion you are a member of a valuable organisation called a Lions Club. Why is that important? Because a well-run Lions club builds better communities to the benefit of all.

What's a well-run Lions club? A club where the leaders lead by example. They inspire and respect their members, encouraging good outcomes and rewarding projects. What a worthwhile and valuable role.

How does that apply to you? There are many roles where members can get that feeling of contribution and value: eg. President, Secretary, Treasurer, Membership Chairman. Or training roles: Vice President, minute secretary, assistant treasurer, subcommittee chair, project leader, etc.

CHILDREN OF COURAGE

On Sunday 10th September 2023 we had a lovely afternoon recognising special children for our annual Children of Courage project.

We were small in numbers this year but big in heart. Each of the children received a framed certificate and a Lions Teddy Bear. Parents, grandparents and friends were all there to encourage the children to go forward and receive their gifts.

We then celebrated with a delicious party with some special party food which all children enjoy.

It is one of the special days in Lions that makes you really proud to be a Lion.

MOE LIONS BOOKS PROJECTS

Like elsewhere, books are very popular in the Latrobe Valley but even more so in Moe and Newborough, where members of the Lions Club of Moe have not one but two major book related community service projects.

The first of these, a home library service for the housebound, comprises two separate teams of Lions Club members who, under the direction of the very caring and efficient Library staff and Lions Coordinator, Lion John Kerr, rotate through a flexible rostering arrangement to provide a fortnightly delivery of specially selected books and audio books to housebound readers located throughout the Moe/Newborough area.

"The project has been operating for over ten years now", said John when asked his thoughts on the project, "the service supplies about thirty regular recipients with new names being added occasionally as the need arises. I think they appreciate the contact as much as they appreciate getting the books", he said.

The second book related project known as 'Books4Kids' was born in early 2019 when Project Coordinator, Lion Rob Sharrock became aware of the degree of poverty-based illiteracy within the Primary School aged children of the Latrobe Valley. "I was absolutely astounded" Rob said, "the figure quoted at the time was a staggering 38%. This

meant that in an average classroom of 20 to 25 children, as many as eight to ten of them did not have adequate reading and writing skills and were struggling to keep up. On analysis, the root cause of the problem appeared to be that almost two in every five of our Primary School aged children did not have access to suitable, quality reading material at home and had not really experienced the joy of being read to and learning to love reading from a very early age".

Since its introduction, the 'Books4Kids' project has now rehomed more than 50,000 children's books and the process is laughably simple. Books are provided free of any charge or condition to almost 50 drop points at Primary and Pre approximately within Schools kilometres of Newborough. The project services many of the larger Primary and Pre Schools in Moe/Newborough, Morwell, Churchill, Trafalgar, Yinnar and Traralgon, as well as many smaller schools including those at Tanjil South, Darnum, Rawson, Willowgrove, Narracan, Yinnar South, Tyers and Toongabbie to name a few. The children can then pick and choose as many as they like to take home and keep, no strings attached.



"The books come from all over," Rob said, "with the logistics being a bit daunting at times. Many are donated locally and a great deal get dropped off at my school crossing in Newborough. Strangers ring me to donate books. My daughter collects them for me from her friends in Melbourne and Jeff and Melinda from the Free Children's Book Charity 123Read2Me have been extremely supportive of the project in allowing us access to their huge stockpile and to take as many of any particular genre as we want whenever we want."

"As I see it, if children do not have the ability to read and write adequately on graduating from Primary School they will most likely experience major difficulty in coping at secondary school level and in all probability, fail to graduate. This in turn, could then lead to a dependence on social security or at best, low paid menial employment with the possible end result being a new generation of poverty and all of its inherent social issues. This is a way to break that cycle. The kids are our future. They all deserve to succeed and this is one positive thing that we can do to help".

DROMANA LIONS FREE TUTORING PROGRAM

The Dromana Lions Club free tutoring program is kicking off in earnest for Term 4 2023 and then into Term 1 2024

This program is for Year 4 to Year 6 children who've fallen behind and whose families can't afford private tutoring.

- All tutoring is performed by retired teachers or teacher aides
- One or two sessions per week
- One hour per session (or shorter where appropriate)
- 4:00-5:00pm or 5:00-6:00pm weekdays
- Conducted at Dromana Community House
- Literacy, numeracy, science and more
- Blocks of eight sessions per child on a need basis, first come first served
- All sessions supervised by a Lions Club member in addition to the tutor

This is available to all children within Zone 10 (keeping in mind that sessions are currently held in Dromana).

Please spread the word, as we have teachers ready and willing to help. I'm sure there are plenty of families who can benefit, it's now just a matter of getting the word out.


